I know he is going to someone he has chosen, but like I am with all my family I am jealous of the moments I've had with him and will have no longer. David and I didn't choose our relationship it just was and what it was, was good. I am full of experience that will recede into memory. I am just going to miss him. Damn that Morten!

And bless him, and bless David and bless the life they have chosen.

When ever I leave my cousins, aunts, uncles, sister/brother, nephews, niece's mother and now my son (in college) I am always full to tears with gratitude that we all have such moments together. I am full with expectation of the next time we will be together. I dream of it, think about it, plan for it, anticipate and relish it when it finally happens. So here is to the next time David, I am looking forward to it.

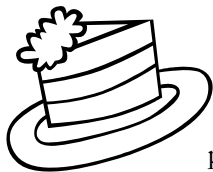

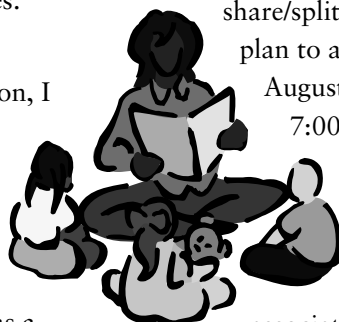
When I first heard a Godly play presentation, I was struck by the way it brought the story of Abraham to life. I saw how this reenactment of the historical bible could help children create an interpretation of our faith with meaning for them. For a cradle Episcopalian such as myself, this was a surprising invigoration to my feelings toward Sunday school.

Last year, our community of four and five year olds enjoyed learning about the people of God as we followed the seasons from Advent to Easter. A multimedia collection of artwork was created that reflects our mutual experience. Many of the children began retelling their favorite Godly play stories. And all cherished the feast and communion we shared before returning home to our families.

If you have a child who will be joining the "Four and Five Year Old Godly Play" Sunday School at Epiphany this Fall or if you are interested in helping the next generation, I invite you to share in the experience of Godly play with us on Sunday mornings.

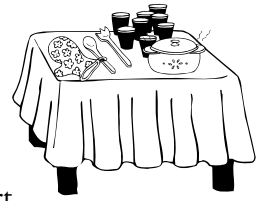
Sunday School Registration

The Order of the Daughters of the King



Have you ever noticed the little silver cross that some of the ladies of Epiphany wear? Have you wondered about the “decoration” on the cross? And what about the blue banner in the entrance hall?

The one with the “decorated” cross on it? Well... that “decoration” is really three Latin words that mean “With heart, mind and spirit uphold and bear the cross.” At the bottom of the cross are three English letters – F H S – For His Sake.

We would like to introduce you to The Daughters of the King, an Order for women who are communicants of the Episcopal Church, churches in communion with it, or Churches in the Historic Episcopate, founded in 1885. Members undertake a Rule of Life, incorporating The Rule of Prayer and The Rule of Service. By reaffirmation of our Baptismal and Confirmation promises, a Daughter pledges herself—before the clergy and congregation of her parish—to a life-long program of prayer, service and evangelism, dedicated to the spread of Christ’s Kingdom and the strengthening of the spiritual life of her parish.

The Rule of Prayer: We pray daily for our Bishop, our parish clergy, our parish family and those persons who have requested our prayers for themselves and/or someone near and dear to them.

The Rule of Service: In our Epiphany Chapter, we do not have a collective area of service, but rather each Daughter involves herself in the area she can serve best—prayer, listening, Lay Reader, choir, Altar Guild, usher, ECW, office help, Eucharistic Minister, and more as the occasions arise.

At Epiphany, we meet at the church on the 1st Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. until noon. The first part of our time together includes prayer, updating our prayer list, and a short business (chapter, Diocesan, National) session. The last hour, and whatever minutes are available from the first hour, are spent in Bible Study and/or a planned program.

Episcopal Church Women

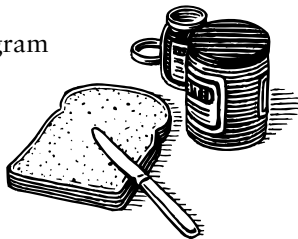
All Episcopal women are Episcopal Church Women (ECW). If you are an Episcopal woman not yet involved in ECW, we who are involved cordially invite you to take part.

Here at Epiphany we meet on the second Tuesday of every month, September through May, for sandwich making at ten o'clock, a program at eleven, and a potluck lunch at twelve. At the September meeting this year our Associate Rector Cynthia Hizer will speak to us about her spiritual journey. Our Assisting Priest Barbara Ryder and our monk Brother Aelred Dean will bring multi-part programs to us later in 2007-08. We hope that sometime during the year our former rector Claiborne Jones will talk to us about Emmaus House and her trip to Africa with Bishop Alexander's group. We are also looking at adventures such as visiting the exhibit of Judaic and Christian art from the Middle East at the Carlos Museum at Emory.

So every month we enjoy inspiring speakers, Epiphany friends, and good food. But beyond nourishing ourselves, our main purpose is to minister to needs in the church and the community, and we do this with the money we raise. Every year we work to raise money and give it all away.

For many years we have supported programs for the underprivileged and needy. We contribute to the Decatur Cooperative Ministry, and the Decatur Emergency Assistance Ministry which provide emergency help for rent, utilities, and food. Emmaus House has taken on new importance for us since our Claiborne Jones became director there. We have contributed to its general fund and its special Children's Summer Program.

We have started a sandwich program for the Poverty Rights Office at Emmaus House. Many of the people who come to the office are hungry. Before our monthly meetings we form an assembly line in the Epiphany kitchen to make some 150 sandwiches which the office can keep in its freezer

and hand out as needed. They tell us the sandwiches are gone in a few days.

Within the church, we have made gifts to our sextons, Joe Clay and James Walker. Brother Aelred, who led us in Bible study for five of our meetings, received an honorarium, with our gratitude. We have provided cards and stamps for our card lady, Sarah Jane Wollison, who sends out cards all year.

This year we had a special request from a parishioner to buy gift packets for service men returning from their second tour of duty in Iraq. Thanks to our gift, approximately fifty single men who landed at Fort Carson, Colorado, with no family to meet them and no luggage, had toiletries and other items to tide them over till their bags arrived.

Our total gifts, September 2006 to August 2007, look like this: DCM, DEAM, and Emmaus House \$800.00; our sextons \$250.00; Brother Aelred \$200.00; returning soldiers \$500.00; cards and postage \$67.00; sandwiches for four months \$220. We plan to make sandwiches every month, at an average cost of \$50.00.

We have no set dues. Any donations go into our treasury to be given away. If you'd like to join us, come to a second-Tuesday meeting. If you'd like to know more, get in touch with Ruth Olson (404.299.1934) or Audrey Banfield (770.465.7301).

Carbon Footprint Update

Some possibly confusing data on the forms handed out a few weeks ago are under automobile usage, home usage and total household carbon. Since we're doing this for just three months, please ignore the references to 12 months.

Use miles driven and CO2 emitted per three months for the three months (July 22 through Oct. 22) we're doing the carbon footprint. Also use under home usage CO2 emitted per unit of energy and

CO2 emitted per three months. Under total household carbon, again use three months rather than per year.

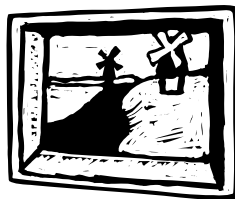
We did not include air travel, which is especially bad for the environment, but check the back of the form for tips on reducing air travel.

Also, it is more effective if you compare home usage to what you used a year ago. Georgia Power includes the year ago comparison (kilowatts used, cost and cost per day) on your electric bill, as well a comparison with the previous month. I had to call Georgia Natural Gas for the comparison, but they were happy to provide it.
