I never looked forward to it. I ran the mile my junior year in High School. I always dreaded the start. We would bunch up, fifteen or twenty of us, then wait for what seemed interminable seconds for the gun to go off. In those seconds, my body tingled, I panted, and I was generally a nervous wreck. The gun would boom and we were off and running at what seemed an impossible pace for four laps around the track. After a few hundred yards I would relax as the realization dawned on me that I had a ways to go.

So here we are at the start again. And I am full of that anticipatory tingling all over again. Now however the race is a little different. It's not about crossing a finish line. It is about creating an adult education program, fulfilling our mandate to seek and serve Christ in people, it is about being faithful in the breaking of bread and in our prayers, it is about nurturing our children, and families, it is about caring for the broken and lonely people in our midst, it is about being faithful to our mission. It is a wholly different kind of race. We all run it together, exulting in each other's triumphs and despairs.

Here are some of the ways I hope we will encourage each other to run this year:

- September 5th we begin confirmation classes at 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall, confirmation will be on October 21st when the Bishop comes to visit, everyone is welcome (to be confirmed or not).
- Children's education and Adult education begins on September 9th; this fall in Adult Ed we will explore our worship for several weeks and then look at other faith traditions and how that informs our disparities and connectedness with other cultures around the world.
- We are going to build a Habitat House with the inter-faith community: Jewish and Muslim starting October 14th.
- We are going to start a youth group.
- We are going to explore a worship service that will be family oriented, a children's chapel service and family worship.
- We are going to work on our vision for 2012.
- We are going to talk about our stewardship of our time, and our gifts, and our money in neighborhood gatherings.
- We are going to have fun.

Okay, so that last one is how I have revisioned the metaphor of race running in the church. I never had much fun running the mile. I was always relieved when it was over. But things are different now. I enjoy the race now. I am relieved when it starts now because I have the great comfort in knowing that we run together, in all our disparate ways and that that is the way God made it, this race we run, this life we live. And it is fun, our life together. I am looking forward to it.

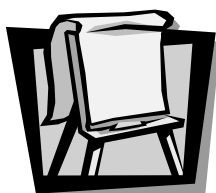
The schedule of the upcoming focus group sessions is as follows:

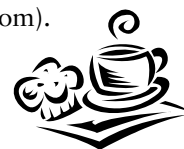


Thank You, Thank You, Thank You

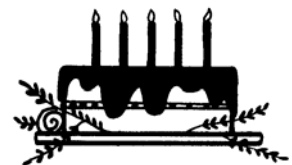

What's Happening in Deepdene?

"What's Happening in Deepdene?" is the subject of a public meeting sponsored by the Olmsted Linear Park Alliance (OLPA) on Thursday, September 6, at 7:30 p.m. in the Epiphany parish hall. Spencer Tunnell, the landscape architect responsible for planning the restoration of the 50-acre linear park according to Frederick Law Olmsted's original design, will make a presentation and answer questions. In 2008 OLPA hopes to complete its capital campaign (including a long-term maintenance fund) and finish work in Deepdene, the 22-acre segment that lies across Ponce de Leon from Epiphany. Members of the parish have a special invitation to attend the meeting.

Epiphanites To Build Habitat House With Interfaith Atlanta

The Outreach Committee is excited to announce that we will be building a Habitat House with Interfaith Atlanta, a diverse group of faith communities seeking to learn more about each other while doing good work in the world around us. A wonderful mixture of communities will be working and sharing with us, including Temple Sinai, Central Presbyterian, Unitarian Universalist Congregation, Shrine of The Immaculate Conception, Buckhead Christian Fellowship, The Ismaeli Muslim Community, The Atlanta Masjid of AL-Islam, Dor Tamid, and First Presbyterian Church. During successive breakfast and lunch breaks, a participating community will provide education on their faith tradition to the other participants.

The work will occur for seven weeks beginning on October 14 and ending on December 2. Each Sunday for the seven-week period, Epiphany will have a team working on the house. While trying to maintain some continuity, we will strive to involve as many members as possible. During the seven-week period, we will also be coordinating teams to work on Saturdays at the Habitat for Humanity warehouse building prefabricated portions of homes. To work on construction a person must be at least 16 years old. However, we are planning to involve the youth of the parish in preparing meals for the workers and helping with fundraising.
