GPS

We had been on the sandbar an hour. We fished, smoked a cigar, swam, had a little excitement when my nephew, son and brother-in-law all got swept away by an imperceptibly strong current. This was how I imagined it: long, leisurely, whatever we wanted to do we would do. I had been imagining this trip for almost 25 years. We were fulfilling a dream I've had to float down the Savannah River from Augusta to Savannah, since we moved to Augusta in 1979.

So we shoved off the sandbar and a few miles (or so we thought) further downstream I asked Luke, our technologically savvy companion, if he would mind checking out the GPS (Global Positioning Satellite) unit and see how far we'd come, how fast, and how much further we had to go. The GPS tracks all that via a satellite system, down to the yards and feet of your current position.

He looked, tweaked some knobs, and scrolled some buttons and viola! He declared we had gone approximately 3.2 miles from our put in and we had 29 miles to go. "Impossible" I declared. It was already approaching lunchtime and we still had 90% of our distance to travel if we were going to make it all the way to Savannah on time to meet our ride back to Augusta!?! How could that be?

We looked, checked, took out maps, checked mile markers on the water, and yep sure enough we only gone three miles. Needless to say our vision of what we wanted to do and what we needed to do were vastly different. What I wanted was leisure. What we needed was pace. What I wanted was the fulfillment of a childlike, romantic vision. What we needed was the real distance, in the real world of the river. What I wanted was relaxation bordering on complacency. What we needed was diligence in the face of many distractions the river had to offer: alluring oxbows, alligators, sand bars, likely fishing spots, and convivial breakfasts around the campfire.

Needless to say the GPS helped us figure it out. It's a tool that put our three dimensional life together in wonderful reality so that we could make good choices about where to go next, what kind of pace to keep, where we could dally and enjoy and what to look out for along the way. It was indispensable.

This summer you are going to hear about something we, the vestry and staff, are going to call "Vision 2012", or something like that. What it is really is a process, a tool that we are going to use to gauge our journey together. To help us talk about our three dimensional life of spirituality, space and social connections. Vision "2012" is going to be our GPS. We will use it to know where we are, where we are going, and how we want to get where we want to go.

For me at the end of the day, I want to enjoy it as much as possible, just like I did my trip down the river. It was the fulfillment of a dream. A dream I never imagined I would have. Back in 1979, when I first thought about it, I couldn't have imagined my grown son, fishing, laughing, mocking and camping right along side me. I wouldn't have had it any other way. So here's to sharing our dream together as we do the work of "Vision 2012". I couldn't imagine doing this with you all just two years ago. I wouldn't want that any other way either.

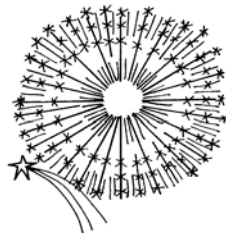

EfM – Education for (Lay) Ministry Group

To Continue



*Meeting Tuesday
Nights this Fall*

If you are interested in exploring topics of theology, the Bible, church history and traditions, you might be interested in signing up for the EfM group at Epiphany that will resume meeting weekly in late August or early September.

Education for Ministry (EfM) is a four-year program of theological-distance-education for lay people offered through the School of Theology at University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. This program combines theological reflection, small group interaction and Bible study, providing a grounding for exploring lay ministry.

The classes serve to continue the education of the laity while allowing individuals to share and

reflect on their life journey in relationship to the topics shared. A major goal of the program is to help each person explore, clarify and develop her or his lay ministry. Participants learn to “think theologically” as dialogue reveals insights and ideas. Readings take approximately 2-3 hours weekly.

The class will meet at Epiphany on Tuesday from 6:30-9 p.m. from late August/early September through May. Tuition is approximately \$340 per year. A person may join EfM at Year One or continue study from a previous EfM group. Registration is due by July 15.
