Our Mission

Nourished by worship and witness, learning and teaching, fellowship and service, we strive to live out the Gospel's radical values with gladness of heart.



Sacrament of Relationship

I always ask couples, "when does the sacramental journey begin"? And typically, they respond with high minded platitudes or things they think a priest might want to hear. I hear, "it begins with love"? Or, "trust", "respect". As I keep frowning they usually, fall silent look quizzical and probably wonder what in the world they've gotten into.

So I push. I say "think about a smokey bar room". Brows furrow. Eyes light up. "Think about seeing her walk up to the bar, what happens"!!!!!!?

Ahhhhhhhhhh. The light of recognition dawns. Ohhhhhhhhhhh. Then they start to get it. Right. Yes. Outward and visible.

Oh yeah. Inward and invisible. Then another round of ah's and oh's and yeah, getting it as they both kind of get that the outward and visible journey to understanding, experiencing the inward and invisible truths of what might be going on start with a sideways glance, a look that lights a fire.

The outward pointing at the inward truths, the inward truths making outward manifestations. Sacrament, things moving from idea and want and thought and feeling to action, and material and purpose and fruition. It is the sacramental process. Its what happens when you fall in love. It's what happens when you try to make a life together. It's what relationships are all about. And not just married couples!

There's the rub, we think it is just about married life and its not. Its about friends and uncles, and nephews and nieces and brothers and sisters and fathers and daughters and mothers and sons and enemies and lovers and strangers and acquaintances, its about that very, terribly profound notion that John Donne put forward oh so many years ago that when a person dies we should not ask "...for whom the bell tolls, it toll for thee...".

We did a workshop recently at Epiphany for gay and lesbian couples to talk about the sacrament of relationship. To at the same time demystify the notion that marriage between a man and a woman is the only place the sacrament happens, and in the same breath to celebrate the holy mystery of sacrament between partners that love each other and want to see and celebrate the outward and visible manifestations of the inward and invisible truths and graces that give their lives meaning, and have for some for years.

We need to start sharing the same language in the church about human sexuality and human relationships so that we can free ourselves of us and them categorical thinking which leads to us and them moralizing, which well we know where it goes.

So lets take it somewhere else, lets talk about the sacrament of relationship as it pertains to any relationship. Let's talk about how love shows itself, how trust gets born out of vulnerability, how respect emerges when two people, aunts and nieces, brothers, partners, fathers and sons, decide to honor the unique and awesome particularity of the one they love.

It's a sacrament, a marriage of the inward and outward both holding up the same thing, some beautiful, honest, revealing, holy part of how two people want to live their life together.

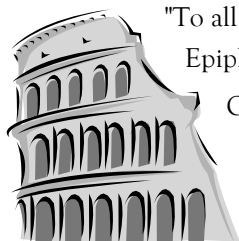
