What ever you call it we are going to do it. On September 7, we are going to have booths set up in the parish hall. We will have a Godly Play session for parents in the church. Children's Education will begin. And, I know you are happy to know, we have a map.

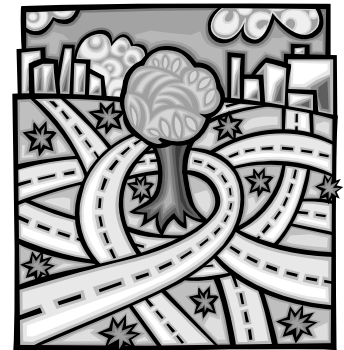

## Epiphany's Art Ministry Welcomes Parishioner Fran Holt for the Month of August

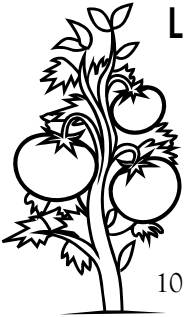
Frances B. Holt grew up in a multigenerational family of artists, so most of her training has been one-on-one with producing photographers and painters. She began both painting (oils) and photography with darkroom work in the mid-1960s. The photography and darkroom techniques she learned from her father, Bob Browder, a Sigma Delta Chi photographer and videographer. Fran continued this work with her first husband, and then free-lanced focusing on men in action – karate, soccer, ROTC activities, bands, and a variety of models. In the 1990s, she studied with an acrylic painter in Douglasville, GA, and began her series of “Parks in Georgia.” Her mother, Vera Browder, was best known for her innovative use of china paint on multiple media. Most recently Fran’s work was part of a four-generation, 12 person exhibit at Georgia Perimeter College’s Clarkston Library exhibit area. The exhibit at Epiphany includes photography, paintings, and china.

“What draws my eye in photography is the play of light on the human figure, frozen in a moment, especially in black-and-white. On the other hand, in my paintings I focus on light, water, and serenity, especially as found in out-of-the-way corners of state, national, and private parks around Georgia. Both light and shadow can hide or reveal so much to the observant eye.” Fran Holt
