Our Mission

New Directions in Music...

I love the creative energy that weaves its way into the daily life and being of this parish; it inspires me to continually offer my best. The Music Advisory committee has assisted me in designing what we believe will be one of our most exciting and engaging seasons yet. I want to take this opportunity to share a portion of the landscape that forms and shapes our musical life together at Church of the Epiphany.

At the end of last season, a shift was made in our philosophy and approach to adult choirs. When I arrived, we had two adult choirs, Matins and Lauds, rehearsing on two different nights of the week and singing differing repertoire. Quickly, it became clear to me that this did not match the worship pattern of the parish—we are one body (the church) who worships at different times primarily because of space limitations. I felt that the adult choir needed to reflect this. Therefore, beginning this fall, we will have one adult choir, The Epiphany Choir, that rehearses on one night of the week together. Choristers have the option of singing at either the 8:45 a.m. or 11:15 a.m. services (or both). The choir will sing as an undivided ensemble for major feast days, concerts, tours, etc.

As I observed further, it became clear that our already rich worship life could be enhanced by implementing a monthly choral evensong, which would require a choir's leadership (in addition to clergy, acolytes, vergers, etc). Since the Epiphany Choir already has a tremendous responsibility in leading the Sunday morning liturgies, we needed to form another choir. The best way to accomplish this was to form a smaller auditioned chamber choir that would have a separate rehearsal. This new choir, the Epiphany Schola Cantorum, will make its debut at our first evensong of the season on Sunday, October 4.

I am very proud of the quality of music-making that happens each time we gather as Epiphanites. In an effort to share this with others in the community, we formed a concert series committee in the spring and began to investigate ways to make Epiphany a "star" in the sacred art-form of music. One of the first fruits of this committee's work is an inspiring brochure of events that I hope you recently received in the mail. If you did not, please contact the church office to receive one. I look forward to seeing many of you at our first concert on September 14.

Our Children's choir program is experiencing some wonderful new changes that better reflect our commitment to children and youth. The Junior Choristers (age 4 through grade 1) will have the opportunity to learn together through improvisation and play on a new set of Orff instruments. This is our largest and most robust group of singers! The Senior Choristers (grades 2 through 8) will use the training modules of Voice for Life, a curriculum developed by the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) and used among the most successful choir programs in the country. In an attempt to have more children involved, our Senior Choristers will have multiple week-night rehearsals to choose from. A full meal will be available on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Two other instrumental ensembles are also in formation. The Handbell Choir will resume rehearsals this year, and I hope that many of you will find your place in this group on Wednesday evenings at 6:15 p.m. It is a fun group! If you play a wind or string instrument, I hope you will consider joining our Contemplative Music Ensemble (new name TBA). This group will support several of our Sunday evening Rite III services.

Do you know about our cycling team - the intrepid All Stars? We have ridden the MS-150 for the past 14 years or so. This is a fund-raiser for multiple sclerosis research. We would love to have you join the team. We are a group at all levels of proficiency and endurance, but competition is not our game. Our fast riders go ahead, but we all eat lunch at the same time and meet for breakfast and dinner together too. Each rider is responsible for a minimum of \$250 in fund-raising - most of us raise more. The ride is two days, two 75-mile loops Saturday and Sunday, from Callaway Gardens - gorgeous countryside. Yours truly does many of these miles with her bike in the "SAG wagon" van, but I wait for the team riders and we cross the finish line together (very steep climb at the end of the loop both days). We are, after all, a *constellation* of All Stars. The parish has been a great support for us, both monetarily and with all-important encouragement. This ride is the second weekend of September: Friday September 12-Sunday September 14. Most of us try to make the fabulous Friday evening street party in Pine Mountain, and most of us ride both Saturday and Sunday - but partial rides are all right as well. 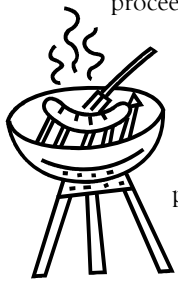

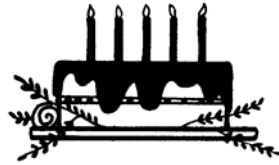
