God, on a recent Sunday morning:

November 26, 2008

"What would you like to do for your work today, N?" M asked.

"I want to paint."

So M showed N where the paints were, and the paper. He chose a cup of water and a throw rug and sat down on the floor on the rug and placed on the rug his painting board, paper, paints and water. Then he sat and looked at the paper.

"What would you like to paint for your response to the story?" M asked him.

"God," N said.

And so a big splot of red paint hit the paper.

"I don't have any grey. I need grey," N said.

So M showed N how to mix black and white to make grey.

Then some brush strokes of grey created a semi-circle with a line pointing down. The semi-circle enclosed the red splot.

Then N filled the paint brush with yellow and drew a big circle above the grey semi-circle and red splot. A big yellow circle.

The chalice and the host. The wine and the bread.

One of our six-year old Epiphanites had just painted God.

And if that wasn't enough, N liked his round yellow circle so much he painted a few more. He sat back and looked at his picture of God.

"I just painted too many," N said.

"No problem," said M in a brilliant recovery move. "We always have extra bread. That's what we call reserved sacrament. The extra bread gets saved so we can give it to people who are sick and can't come to church on Sunday."

N sat back and smiled at his picture.

This is a typical morning in our Sunday School classrooms. It is filled with wondering questions and epiphanies. It is filled with children learning a new language to express old stories.

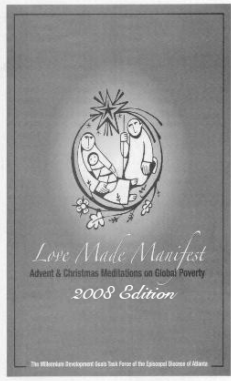
We had just finished hearing the story of creation. We followed the six days, with light and dark, land and water, birds and fish, plants and animals - both the four-footed and the two-footed. We heard how, after each day, God looked at these creations and called them good. We watched how God rested on the seventh day and sat back and enjoyed creation. We talked about how we like to rest too, on a day we call Sabbath. A day we go to church and remember and enjoy all the things God created.

Nothing was said about wine or chalice or host or bread.

The Wednesdays of Advent

December 3 and December 10 from 7 to 8 p.m., with a Healing service on December 17.

As a way for us to honor the season of Advent, join us around the front area in the church for a special Advent program. For two Wednesday nights we will enter the prayer practice of “Lectio Divina” or sacred reading, an ancient form of meditation that develops our relationship with God. On the third Wednesday of Advent, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Thomas with a Healing Service and Eucharist at 7 p.m.

Lectio Divina was first described by a 12th century Carthusian monk called Guigo. Instead of reading Scripture, however, we are going to meditate on some of our Nativity displays. The program will combine meditation, music, and sharing as we go through the four stages of sacred reading of *lectio* (slow reading), *meditatio* (reflection), *oratio* (our prayerful response) and *contemplatio* (a simple resting in God). But our child N, had put it all together. He got God out of this story and translated it, on his own, as chalice and host. From years of coming to the altar rail with his family, probably since he was in diapers, of having the little round yellow bread placed in his hand and the chalice lifted to his lips, he experienced how God comes near to us and we come near to God.

N was able to experience God in this way, coming to the altar rail as a young child, because we have what we call “open communion.” This means all are welcome at our table – ALL are welcome. All ARE welcome. All are WELCOME.

Through the Godly Play story materials, made possible in our classrooms by tithing from the Epiphany community, he remembered how God comes near. He painted it and enjoyed it and sat back and saw that it was good.

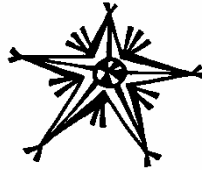



Pastoral Care

The Shepherding Program



Members of the pastoral care committee have been meeting since April to develop a mission statement and to put that statement into action. Our Mission: *We are called to put our faith into action – to identify and respond to pastoral needs in our parish community, so that all may experience the reconciling love of Christ.* As our parish continues to grow, we want to ensure that the needs of individuals and families in our church community are known and addressed and that we maintain a community where we all feel cared for and connected. We believe that one way to do this is to establish a shepherding program.

Shepherds are parishioners who feel a calling or desire to assist their fellow parishioners. A shepherd can be a long-or short-term member of Epiphany or somewhere in between. Approximately seven individual or family households will be assigned to a shepherding cluster based on geographical location. The shepherd will be responsible for maintaining contact with cluster members in an informal, friendly way. As needs are identified, the shepherd may respond to them directly, by enlisting the help of others within the shepherding cluster, or by requesting assistance from other parish resources or the clergy. Again, this is meant to be a low-key, informal way to support each other. Some clusters may wish to schedule social times together. Shepherds are asked to make a one-year commitment to serving their cluster.

You will be receiving a letter within the next few weeks from our rector asking you to consider serving as a shepherd. We hope to have the program up and running in January 2009. Members of the pastoral care committee will be available during the coffee hour on December 7 to answer questions and provide more details.
