## Our Mission

The Episcopal Church of the Epiphany is an inclusive community called to seek and follow Jesus Christ. We welcome all people in the Eucharistic fellowship of Christ's Body. We receive strength and encouragement at the common table to carry out Christ's work of reconciliation in our broken world. Nourished by worship and witness, learning and teaching, fellowship and service, we strive to live out the Gospel's radical values with gladness of heart.



## Music and Liturgy for Lent

Early spring for both Jews and Gentiles was a season for preparing to make a fresh start, and purifying oneself and one's surroundings in acknowledgement of complete human dependence upon the divine. The Anglo-Saxon word *lenct*, which survives in our word *lengthen*, names the liturgical season of Lent. The days are lengthening; spring will soon be in the air (believe it or not). For Christians, Lent it is a time of spring cleaning as we prepare to celebrate our deliverance out of death into life.

To begin, ashes mark our foreheads in the sign of the cross. These gritty ashes recall more than mortality: ashes have long been a component of soap as a cleansing agent. Paradoxically, the filthy smudge we wear shows our desire to come clean. Lent gives us the opportunity to get our spiritual houses in order before participating in the Three Days (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter) of our baptismal passage from death into life.



The church's liturgy seeks to enter the realm of God among those gathered in worship each week. You will notice at least two significant changes to our liturgy during the season of Lent. First, we will process in silence. Processions were an important part of medieval liturgies and invoked the biblical exodus out of Egypt and sojourn in the wilderness. Perhaps our silent procession each week can be an outward symbol of our own wandering into places of wilderness. Second, we will replace the hymn of praise with the historic *kyrie eleison* (Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy) as a petition for God to have mercy upon our human condition. This text was first used in 4<sup>th</sup> century Jerusalem and Antioch; originally in Greek, it appears to be derived from Jewish and pagan liturgical formulas.

It has become my own tradition to omit Closing Voluntaries during Lent to allow for a time of quiet reflection at the conclusion of worship. I encourage you to use these various times of silence to reflect upon the journeys of your life. Use them as a time for internal singing of the song that is deep within us; the song that cries out in hope and mercy to the Holy One.

## Oratio - Laboro - Epulatio

Epiphany it is time to "surge illuminare"...to rise and shine! The Buildings and Grounds Committee is sponsoring a work day on Saturday, February 24 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. The day will follow a monastic rhythm of Oratio/Prayer, Laboro/Work and Epulatio/Eat. Br. Aelred will lead



Morning Prayer and cook lunch for the volunteers. The work day, weather permitting, will be focused on raking leaves, cleaning flower beds, and picking up the grounds. For those who want to participate but would like to work inside...don't worry...opportunities will abound.

Bring wheelbarrows, pruning shears, tarps (they work great for gathering limbs and other small debris), and lots of enthusiasm. Also, a reminder to wear gloves, long pants, and other appropriate wear. The parish will provide bags for collecting debris and any other specific supplies required for day.

## Adult Education

**Through February 10:** Fran Holt-Underwood will teach an Adult education class on "The Bible in English before Wycliffe." Most people think that the first Bibles in English were either Wycliffe's or Tyndale's and that the first authorized version was the King James Version in 1611.

However, there were several authorized attempts to translate a complete Bible into Old English. This short adult ed seminar will cover: texts, translations, and protests; manuscripts and their transmission; Old English poetry as Bible expansion and interpretation; how Christian was *Beowulf*? (if you've seen the newest movie, come and share); Old Testament Heptateuch in Old English; Gospel, Psalms, Proverbs and Homilies in Old English; and the monastic reform and other prose texts in Old English. Take home trivia will be served for dessert.

**Through Lent:** Join the Rector for a biblical reflection on the themes of Lent as told through the eyes of Sarah, Jacob, David, Jesus and Paul. This class will read and reflect on the stories of these biblical characters as a window into the heart of Lent. Room B.

## Endowment Fund Grant Applications Being Accepted

The Endowment Fund of the Church of the Epiphany, established by the Vestry in 2001, is designed to enhance the mission of the parish apart from the annual operational budget. Parishioners are encouraged to provide gifts such as bequests in wills, trusts of various types, charitable gift annuities, assignment of life insurance and transfers of cash or property.

According to the Plan or Operation for the Endowment Fund, a portion of the income each year may be used for special purposes such as educational scholarships, church-related camping or leadership conferences, "or such other training which enables members of this congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people." Outreach projects may also include "grants to Episcopal colleges and seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this parish relates, and to special programs designed for those persons in our area who are in spiritual and/or economic need." The Plan of Operations also allows for income to be used for capital improvements, debt reduction, building programs of the Church, or Episcopal-related projects at home and overseas.

Applications for grants should be submitted to the Endowment Board anytime from the date of the Annual Parish Meeting, January 20, 2008, to February 20, 2008. Application forms may be obtained from the Parish Administrator or any member of the Board. The Endowment Board reviews all applications, then forwards its recommendations for funding to the Vestry. Recipients of funding will be notified within one month of the Vestry's action.

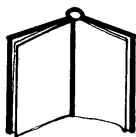
## Chez Epiphany Cooking Classes are Back in Session!

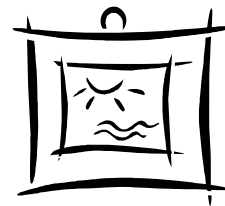
## Episcopal Church Women

## A Cross Walk through Decatur

We are going to walk our way through our parish geography and pray the Stations of the Cross as part of a one day Lenten pilgrimage. We will meet at 9:30 a.m. at the church on February 9. The purpose for this journey is to contemplate our city, our faith journey and our community from the vantage point of the stations of the cross.

The stations reflect the journey that Jesus took on his way to crucifixion and death. We will explore the demographic divides of race, wealth, and poverty and how that is played out against the backdrop of the geography of the city and the spiritual geography of the stations of the cross.

Lunch will be provided. You don't have to walk the whole distance to participate. We will have drivers available to pick people up if you become tired and are unable to continue. You can expect to walk 10 miles over the course of the day. We will move at a pace that is amenable to the group.

## Centering Prayer Workshop

Contemplative Outreach of Atlanta will offer a seven-session program on *Centering Prayer* at Epiphany. The program begins with the all-day workshop from 9:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. on Sat. March 8, and includes six weekly continuing sessions (dates and times for continuing sessions will be determined by workshop participants). The series will introduce participants to the four simple steps of *Centering Prayer* and provide opportunities to practice the discipline in daily life. Centering Prayer is a simple method of prayer, rooted in ancient Christian tradition.

*“Centering Prayer is a method designed to facilitate the development of contemplative prayer by preparing our faculties to cooperate with this gift. It is an attempt to present the teaching of earlier times (e.g. the 14th century book The Cloud of Unknowing) in an updated form and to put a certain order and regularity into it.*


*It is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer; it simply puts other kinds of prayer into a new and fuller perspective. During the time of prayer we consent to God's presence and action within. At other times, our attention moves outward to discover God's presence everywhere.”* ~ From Father Thomas Keating

Contemplative Outreach is a spiritual network of individuals and small faith communities committed to living the contemplative dimension of the Gospel in everyday life through the practice of Centering Prayer. The contemplative dimension of the Gospel manifests itself in an ever-deepening union with the living Christ and the practical caring for others that flows from that relationship.
