Our Mission

The Episcopal Church of the Epiphany is an inclusive community called to seek and follow Jesus Christ. We welcome all people in the Eucharistic fellowship of Christ's Body. We receive strength and encouragement at the common table to carry out Christ's work of reconciliation in our broken world. Nourished by worship and witness, learning and teaching, fellowship and service, we strive to live out the Gospel's radical values with gladness of heart.



Dear Friends in Christ

In the “undercroft” (the area below) the table in my office are stacked ~ seemingly a mile high and a mile wide - many beautiful and sacred objects. These are objects that show their sacredness in part through their beauty ~ handmade, carefully crafted, cut, glued, stained pieces of wood that have been turned into arks, clocks, temples, sheep and shepherd, and golden boxes holding mysterious parables. These are the “stories” of Godly Play, one of our Christian Education curricula for children. It is a Montessori-based program that fosters religious growth and religious language through the use of sacred story, liturgical action, parable, and silence. The stories are ones we know - creation, the flood, baptism, for example, and they lead to wondering questions that help children become more aware of the mystery of God’s presence in their lives.”

And of course, they lead to play. Play itself is important work; it is a response to the stories and the wondering. It is a place in which children discover their deep identity as God’s own beloved.

Epiphany’s Christian Youth Formation Committee feels so strongly about the value of this program that this September, we will be expanding from one Godly Play classroom to three. This will also expand the age range from 4 and 5 year olds through third grade. The committee spent the better part of last year studying curriculums. We looked at curriculums through the lens of our Mission Statement that says that we are

“dedicated to fostering a joy-filled love of God. We strive to make Epiphany a home for all children, and a place they long to go to and want to stay. [We] will nurture and educate our children in the Christian faith and the Episcopal Church. At every phase of education, we will use scripture and liturgical practices and traditions. As we foster the confidence that God is at work in our lives to engage our Holy Imagination, we hope to inspire a long-lasting relationship of peace, outreach and understanding.”

We found the Godly Play program the most compelling, and the one most able to instill the religious growth we want for our children and the one that best fulfilled our mission statement.

To “get ready,” which is one of our favorite Godly Play phrases, we need a place to play. Just as our church is filled with beautiful things, symbolic things that help us come close to God, a Godly Play classroom teaches through its space. It sends an unspoken message of respect, beauty, consistency and care.

To create a Godly Play classroom, it takes a village. A village of craftsmen and teachers and dedicated people who share the vision. First, we asked the Vestry for funding. When the money was awarded in late June, we went right to work. Epiphany’s carpenter guru Bill Graves designed and masterminded the building of beautiful bookcases, and did the lion’s share of the work himself. On successive weekends we have had crews helping seal and sand: Colleen Flood, Nancy Baer, Dave Thompson, Steve Du, Maggie Williamson, Heather Knapp, Peter Schneider.

We are also blessed with a new Epiphany member, Candy Moser, who is the Southeast regional trainer for Godly Play. Through her generosity, all of our teachers will be trained. She has guided us every step of the way, from designing the classrooms to ordering arks and temples and desert boxes.

To help everyone else "get ready," we will be telling Godly Play stories on two upcoming Sundays: August 23 and September 9, with ample time for parents and others to see how the program works and ask questions. We will also hold a gift fair between services, so that people can help us buy these beautiful and sacred objects that will be the teaching tools of our children's faith formation for decades to come.

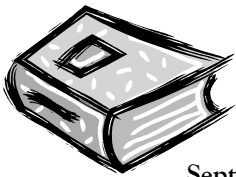
