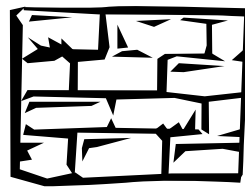
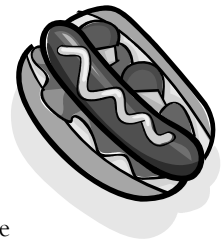


Newcomers' Cookout

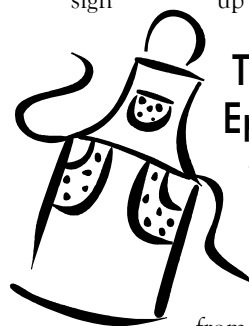

Wanted: Baby Steps

No doubt, all of us Epiphanyites have noticed higher energy costs in the recent weeks. All the media hype, hue and cry about gas prices make us anxious and worried. Weaning us from the cheap gas of yesteryear will take some patience. We can conserve energy by taking small, "baby" steps. We can all take small steps to minimize our energy use. A small step doesn't require more than a bit of resolve to make one foot fall after another.



- Next time you think of a necessary errand, combine it with another trip. Go to church with a neighbor, or ride your bike to the library. A double benefit of combining trips is the time saved. The old saying "time is money" makes more sense when combining errands, especially when fewer miles traveled equals more dollars in your wallet.
- Next time you fire up the grill (charcoal or gas); put a couple of dinners on to cook. You'll enjoy an easy meal later in the week.
- Pick up several CFLs (compact fluorescent light bulb) and pop them in your fixtures. You'll save on your electric bill in two ways this summer—fewer kilowatt hours used illuminating your room and lower heat output by the lights allowing less cooling by the AC.

Try one energy conservation step a week, and you may find yourself less stressed by summer's end.

June 15 Presentation on Burmese Refugees

Plan to join us on Sunday, June 15 between the services in the Parish Hall for a presentation by Eh Kaw Htoo, father of the refugee family Epiphany is sponsoring, and Brian Bolton of Jubilee Partners. Eh Kaw will speak about the Karen people of Burma, who were forced from their villages by the Burmese government and many of whom have lived in refugee camps for over 20 years. Eh Kaw Htoo and his wife Pa-Saw Paw arrived in the camps when they were eight and three years old, respectively. They named their oldest son, now five, Jubilee, because they said "we did not want our son to be born a refugee but to be born in freedom... At that time we did not know if we would ever leave the camp, but we had hope for freedom."

Along with the presentation, the refugee resettlement committee will be hosting a scrumptious breakfast between services on the 15. All proceeds will benefit the refugee family, so please join us!
