I'm Not Ready!

Are you ready for Christmas? Are you ready for God to come sneaking into this world in the form of flesh? Are you ready to hear unimaginable predictions from angels? Are you prepared for one more Christmas party... one more year-end review... one more exam to take or grade... one more toy to put together on Christmas Eve? You would think since Christmas advertising begins in September, we would have further warning and thus prepare ourselves better. But no, even the Black Friday sale papers do not throw us into a thorough preparation.

From 1997 until 2000 I was a primary caregiver for an aunt who eventually died from congestive heart failure. It was a long and fairly slow time of dying. But, one that was clearly inevitable. Death comes to everyone. However, I am not sure that she believed this. As the end of her life came near, the hospice case-worker suggested that those around her might offer words suggesting it was "ok" to leave this life... to let go. One afternoon, her maid was sitting by the bed and offered these words of comfort... "It's ok to go... you can leave the pain of this life..." The response from my aunt, who had been non-responsive for over 48 hours, "I'm not ready!" and thus she lived for three more days. As I look back on it, I often chuckle. This is generally how she lived her life, unprepared and not willing to accept the inevitable.

Ironically, this is often how we deal with Christmas. It is coming! God promises this. We still remain a people caught off-guard, or, maybe, unwilling to prepare. Mary certainly fits this description. As the story goes, she was minding her own business, when all of a sudden God intervened in a significant way in her life. "You're pregnant and I have great expectations for this child." It is the archetypal story of God's intervention, surprising Mary and catching her completely unprepared - not ready!

It seems to me that times of unpreparedness are often the times when God comes to us and intervenes in powerful and significant ways. Maybe we should be thinking of things we take for granted and questioning whether they will always stay the same or whether their very sameness might be fertile ground for God to intervene in a way that catches us unprepared. Many of us imagine that the wars in the Middle East will have no end, the numbers at Peachtree Pine Shelter will always increase at Christmas and at the end of the year, more lay-offs will come. But if we are to take the Christmas story seriously, God can come in times that are particularly uncompromising, in settings that are unimaginable, to people who are completely unprepared, not ready.

I am not sure if this helps with the frantic pace of your life during this season, nor shortens the "to-do" list of items before Christmas, but perhaps it may help to know that at times when we are least prepared and expect very little to change, God surprises us with hope, with encouragement, with new life.

So, may the coming days find you completely unprepared... not ready for the NEW life that God is about to give you in the birth of Jesus Christ. Blessings upon you and your loved ones in the coming days!

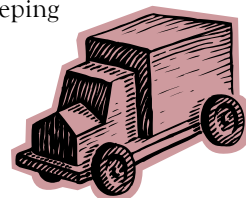
