Enter into the Joy

My annual pilgrimage to Gethsemani (the Trappist monastery in Kentucky that was the home of Thomas Merton) this Christmas octave started on a high note this year. I was riding high from celebrating Christmas Eve Holy Eucharist, and the exuberance of Christmas day—eating and visiting with friends and family, eating too much brisket and pie. I wasn't sure I was ready to enter into the joy of the place.

We left in the dark early Friday morning—Margaret, Andrew and I—and before long, the anticipation of being on a journey kicked in. By midmorning we were noshing our way through Tennessee on all the luscious breads and goodies with which you dear parishioners gifted me. We were giddy from multiple sing-a-longs of "On the Road Again" with Willie Nelson. We seriously considered changing our vacation plans and turning west to Texas. I still wasn't sure I could ramp down enough to enter into the joy of Gethsemani, where "silence is spoken." I wasn't sure I even wanted to.

By chance we turned off the highway to visit a cave in southern Kentucky. Eighty feet down in the ground, past stalactites and stalagmites, dripping and darkness, the air was stifling. No, something more, a pulling of energies out of me, as if the earth itself was calling me into a deep Sabbath rest. When we stumbled out at ground level an hour later, we practically hurled ourselves into the air and light. As we drove the final hour to Gethsemani we all fell into drowsiness. Margaret, the driver, was barely able to stay awake.

I am often aware of the shifting of energies. I feel it happen in conversations. I feel it happen during the Eucharist, right about the time we start singing the Gloria.

That hour underground was the shift. I cannot remember a time when I felt so *stopped*, readied so quickly to enter into the joy of Gethsemani. By the time we could see the spire of the abbey in the distance, my heart and mind were available for whatever was to be given. As I unpacked in my sunny little cell, in this place that has so massaged my spirit and converted my heart to Jesus, I knew I was ready.

The bells were ringing for Vespers at 5:30 p.m., and, in what seemed like another moment, they were ringing again for Vigils at 3:15 a.m. The height and depth of the chapel, with 40 men singing to God the songs of David, in the middle of the night, in the wind-swept mountains of Kentucky, completed the shift. I sat in the balcony, looked down, and felt the radiant, airy energy.

From the readings, taken from 1 John that morning, I could only catch words and snatches of phrases:...eternal life...revealed to us...enter into joy.

Share Your Skills, Support the Shepherding Program

There has been a positive and enthusiastic response from the parish to the Shepherding Program. The number of Shepherds continues to grow. One of the characteristics of successful Shepherding programs is the training and ongoing support given to the Shepherds. We have identified six initial training areas: Engagement, Effective Listening, Crisis Management, Priest-Shepherd Communication, Confidentiality, and Resources. Engagement and Priest-Shepherd Communication will be handled by our priests. We need the help of parishioners with counseling skills to provide training in the other areas. This would be for training purposes only. You would not be expected to give ongoing support to the Shepherds. That is the responsibility of the clergy and members of the Pastoral Care committee. Also, Shepherding is an informal (and important) support, but it is not Pastoral Care. Although we cannot be specific at this time, we do not anticipate this requiring a significant amount of your time. 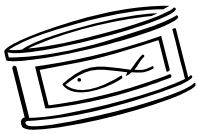

- Community outreach projects

Tom's Artist Statement:

My paintings reflect my love for cities and their structures. My subject is the urban landscape—a dense and complex place, alive with movement that is forever changing, often in unrecognizable ways. Like dreams, the cities in my paintings may contain elements of real places I have lived or visited. But more often, the abstracted cityscapes that I paint are places of fantasy that represent the city experience—the sensation of being in a stimulating, fast-paced, dynamic environment where roads can lead to unexpected places and where buildings can appear almost overnight, transforming a once recognizable space into something strange and dizzying.

My work surfaces, like my subject matter, are dense and multilayered. I employ a variety of techniques to keep my work spontaneous: I work quickly and intuitively and usually work on multiple pieces at the same time; I use a wide variety of materials including acrylic, pastel, charcoal, pencil and markers; and I play loud rock and roll music and dance while I paint.

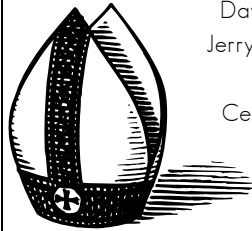

Reception

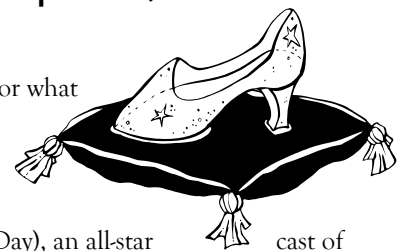
The service of reception is for those who have been both baptized and confirmed in another Christian denomination recognized by the Episcopal Church, but who wish to become Episcopalians. These persons would be "received" into the Episcopal Church.

Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows

Reaffirmation is for those persons who have already been confirmed, but who wish, for whatever reason, to reaffirm their baptismal vows.

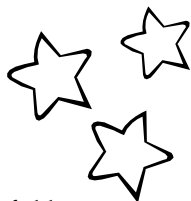

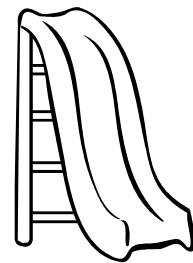

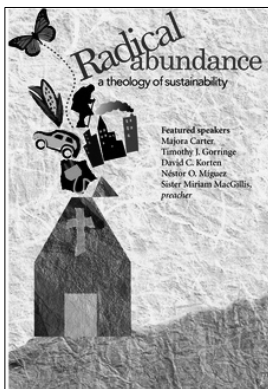
