## Learning from the Mountain

Day packs and good shoes, water bottles and energy bars, rain gear, penny whistles, harmonicas: these are all the essentials for the trail. EGO—Epiphanyites Go Outdoors—an outgrowth of the Earth Guild—headed to the north Georgia mountains last month to listen to God speak to us in nature and to find communion with each other. Thirty of us wore our hiking clothes to church that Sunday morning—even under our surplices and chasubles and stoles—and left after the first service to arrive at the foot of the mountain at Appalalicola State Park by lunchtime—to journey up the mountain.

To trudge five miles uphill, only to walk five miles downhill the next day. To find beauty in nature and communion with each other.

It was supposed to rain, of course. I should have expected it. Every time I have walked this portion of the approach to the Appalachian Trail, it has rained. Almost twenty years ago—before the Hike Inn was built—Margaret and I hiked the same trail in hard rain. We pitched our tent not far from where the Inn is now built, and in the dusk, managed to find some dry sticks and leaf litter. We sat in the darkness by the little fire, feeling its warmth and comfort, as rain fell and lightning raged.

The trail is a friendly place, but that night, as we sat by our little fire, a man appeared out of the darkness. He had gotten a late start on the trail. Could he pitch his tent near ours, and be warmed by our fire? “No,” we said cautiously. “You had better go on.”

I remember that night with a combination of emptiness at my bad sense of hospitality and relief that nothing happened; that he actually complied and walked on; that he knew he was considered the dangerous stranger, even if he wasn't. We don't know how far he walked, or if he pitched his tent some ways away—it was too stormy to know. But I will always remember that while we found beauty in nature on the mountain, the communion part had a big tear in it.

On this trip we did have it all—the power of the mountain, deep smells of cedar, rhododendron, the sense of awe at God's creation. And we reveled in communion with each other—ate, laughed, oohed at the endangered wildflower called Lady Slipper, put ointment on blisters and sore muscles and walked the trail together.

And yet, I tip my hat to the unknown stranger I turned away so many years ago. I wish him comfort and safety and the warmth of a fire in a rainstorm, and communion on his journey up the mountain.

EGO is gearing up for more hikes—next Memorial Day we'll go back to the Hike Inn. This fall we'll walk the Rabun Gap area, and next summer maybe a “big” hike somewhere. Stay tuned for hearing God speak to us through nature and more communion on the mountain.

Twenty two per cent of Mississippi coastal residents have not returned since Katrina. 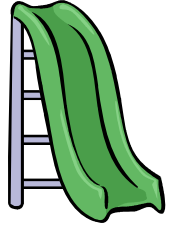
