Now that the dogs have passed on, and our house isn't filled with dog hair and a round space is missing on the couch from where Rosie sneaked up to sleep, we have decided to redecorate.

We have loved our "Santa Fe" look for almost 20 years ~ orange walls, blue checkerboard painted floors. But with the passing of time, and the passing of our beloved animals, the couch and chairs went to the upholsterer, and Margaret went to the paint store.

But first we had to decide where we were going. If not orange and blue, then what? One morning in late summer, I sat looking out the windows into the woods and pastures below. Well, I tried to look into the woods and pastures below, but my eyes were stopped - since we live in a tree house with so much green and brown right at the windows that it is impossible, in deep summer, to see anything else.

Water oaks and tulip poplars and sweet gum trees are the tallest in front of me, except for the pines that hover over everything to the west side. Dogwoods settle underneath. Pungent cedar and juniper and balsam filter in. I love them and they seem to love me, pushing into my living room as if they are part of the family.

St. Hildegard once said, "If you are feeling ill or weak of heart, go sit in the garden, among the green, and you will find rest."

It was immensely restful, that green and brown. I felt an embrace of God's green energy, what St. Hildegard named "*veritas*" a Latin word that means the greening of the world is God. God's greening. The surge of green in a blade of grass or a 50-foot tree looming into my window is all God manifesting.

So: Green and brown. It was easy from then on to find paint and fabric. Every season brings its own yellow, purple, red, gold, umber, black, white, gray. But beneath all the chemical processes that turn chlorophyll into every other color, is green.

Now we have a green sofa and brown chair. A green wall, a brown floor. Hildegard would find rest here.

We will celebrate her feast day on Wednesday evening, September 16, with Evening Prayer. Epiphany's Hildegard Ensemble will sing her beautiful music. A Benedictine abbess in the 13th century, St. Hildegard saw that God was in all of creation, manifesting through green. Maybe it was because she was surrounded by green in her verdant Rhineland valley that she painted her visions of God manifesting and then put those visions to music and words - *o verdant branch*.



Epiphany's Art Ministry welcomes Phil Thomas for September

Phil Thomas was born in Brooklyn, New York, in 1948. He spent his early years in rural Pennsylvania but has lived in Georgia most of his adult life. Coming from a family of talented artists, he had always been interested in drawing and painting yet never seriously pursued painting until later in life. He found his passion for painting in 2002 in a watercolor class. Phil has studied with several nationally known instructors and takes every opportunity available to further his art education. In December 2008, Phil decided to pursue his art career full time after working in accounting and software for many years.



Phil has always had a great love of nature and the great outdoors. His goal is to convey using oil paints his feelings and impressions of a scene. It is initially the light that draws him to a scene. Sometimes he passes right by a scene at one time of day only to return at an earlier or later time of day and have to paint it. Sometimes, surprisingly, it is the gray overcast conditions that attract his attention. He paints many of my paintings on location, "en plein air" amid all the bugs and sometimes hostile weather. His larger studio paintings are usually based on these smaller paintings done outdoors. Many of his still life and figurative paintings are done from life as well. He is still in awe at the magic that occurs when everything comes together and the painting just seems to emerge from the canvas on its own.

He is an award winning artist whose work is displayed in both public and private collections. He is currently an associate member of the Oil Painters of America, a juried member of the Atlanta Artists Center, a member of the Southeastern Pastel Society, the Quinlan Visual Arts Center, the Bowen Center and is past president of the Sawnee Artists Association. He currently serves as treasurer of the Atlanta Artists Center.

(Dillard, as in the sinfully sumptuous Dillard House home-style restaurant!) The cabin is a log house in a secluded woodland environment. It has all the basic comforts of home and plenty of parking space. It overlooks a small park with picnic facilities and a lake. The cabin can sleep up to nine guests (six comfortably). Sleeping accommodations (besides the hosts' own bedroom) are: a main floor guest room with a double bed, a loft with a double and two singles, a spare double mattress that could be used on the main floor, and a non-foldout couch in the living room on the main floor. Tents could be pitched on the front lawn. If the group is large enough to need more accommodations, there's also a lovely B&B less than a mile downhill from the cabin. It's a house and grist mill beside a beautiful waterfall fed by the lake in our park. The Sylvan Falls B&B can sleep up to ten, depending on how many vacancies it has for that weekend. It is the policy of Habitat for Humanity International that children under the age of 14 are not allowed on a Habitat worksite while there is construction in progress. It is further the policy of Habitat that youth ages 14 and 15 can do limited work: painting, landscaping, but should not be on the site during heavy construction. Youth ages 16 and 17 can do general construction and carpentry, but cannot do excavation, demolition, use power tools, work at heights above 6 feet, or do roofing. Minors (under 18) must fill out, and have a parent sign, a Minor Waiver before they can work on site.

She holds a Master of Music degree in Voice Performance from Georgia State University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology and Liberal Studies from Emory University. Currently, she is completing a doctorate in performance from the Indiana University School of Music in Bloomington, Indiana, and is a soprano soloist in the choir at Cathedral of St. Philip. She made her international operatic debut as *Erste Knabe* in Mozart's *Die Zauberflöte* in Rome, Italy. Admission is free and the concert is open to the public.
