Was It Really Like That?

It is New Year's Eve, in Indiana, and we have a dinner gathering, including Richard, a friend from high school days. Richard is regaling my mother and Margaret and others with stories that were slightly different from the way I had remembered them.

We had chemistry first class of the day, and as Richard remembers it, I would come in and, right away, weigh some stuff on one of the scales. "She was on a diet [weren't we always?], and then she would drink it. It looked awful." Was it really like that?

Then our German teacher, Mr. Gehrig. He was an affable guy with an authentic German accent. Richard remembers kids passing notes back and forth to each other, hiding them in his briefcase. Once, a note contained commentary about Mr. Gehrig himself- maybe his bald head, or his odd accent, I figured.

Mr. Gehrig intercepted the note, and after reading it, took Richard out into the hall to talk about the meaning of hatred. He knew all about that, he said, and rolled up his sleeve to display his number from Auschwitz. He was Jewish and had been in the Nazi camps. Richard recoiled in sorrow. All these years I never knew Mr. Gehrig's righteous anger, and I hadn't known Richard's contrite heart. I hadn't remembered this part of the story. Was it really like that?

Finally, Richard apologized to me for stealing away the place of salutatorian in our graduating class, which put me in third place. First and second positions received full scholarships to college, but third got nothing. He took an easy elective, and I worked on the school play. He got class credit and I didn't. "It raised my GPA just enough to edge you out," he said to me, on this New Year's Eve, 40 years later. "I'm sorry."

Was it really like that? I remembered that Richard was just smarter. His take was much more compassionate. I hadn't remembered the scales and food - I just remembered a negative body image. And I hadn't remembered Herr Gerhig's true story.

In our Psalm today, in the evening office, Psalm 33 instructs us to "sing for him (the Lord) a new song."

At the beginning of this brand new year, we are given a chance to re-sing our song with perhaps a more truthful or mature or compassionate ending. Maybe we're just tired of telling our story the same old, hurtful way. Maybe we are ready to rise up with a new ending, a healed ending.

This is part of the freedom we find as we sift through and let things go and reconcile others. It might be time for a new song, perhaps from the perspective from which God sees us and has seen us all along.

Whether it is stories about body or brain or heart, I wonder, what is your story? Our Lenten adult Sunday School program is about telling our stories.

Will you join in?

However, parents will need to purchase tickets for any children attending the dinner and show in the parish hall.

Endowment Fund Grant Requests

The annual window for requesting grants from the Endowment Fund of the Church of the Epiphany will remain open until **February 17, 2010**. Limited dollars are available for grants each year, a percentage of the Fund balances over the prior three years. Grants may be used for:

- A. Capital improvements, debt reduction, or the building program of The Church of the Epiphany.
- B. Scholarships or grants to members of the Church of the Epiphany for the purpose of attending college, seminary, nursing or medical school; for church-related camping or leadership conferences; or such other training which enables members of this congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people.
- C. Outreach into the community including, but not limited to, grants to Episcopal colleges and seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this parish relates, and to special programs designed for those persons in our area who are in spiritual and/or economic need.
- D. Projects of the Episcopal Church at home and overseas.

Sunday Morning Lenten Series

Your Story, My Story, God's (Our) Story

Benno's sermon of January 10 made reference to the "highly improbable" character of the Incarnation as God's way of being connected to us...a Jesus who shared the human condition with us, occupying his space in the ordinary and everyday in order to show us that this, too, was our space for going to God.

That *highly improbable* character for God's operations in the world extends to the stories of every one of us. Each of our lives holds significant moments and relationships that shape the ways in which we move through the world. They deserve to be told—not least to ourselves. Our stories are emblems for God speaking God's word through each of us. They are points of meeting, for a mutual recognition of our gifts and for naming what God has planted in our lives. They begin to answer that curious question that can be asked of any of us in church, *Why are you here?*

With that, I invite you to consider a five-week conversation at Epiphany on the telling of our stories as the means of caring for our lives and for God's call in our lives. Too often, we go to someone else's story or teaching in order to learn how God is speaking to us. The space I invite you to is a space of disciplined conversation, of holy listening, of what Parker Palmer refers to as "hearing one another into deeper speech." That space is a space of Vocation Care, a space of mutual encouragement (Rm. 1:11-12), of hearing and seeing our lives the way God hears and sees them.

We will meet over five Sundays in Lent at the Adult Ed. Hour.

- 8 x 10, 12 x 16, 12 x 12, 24 x 18 , 24 x 24, for canvas frames. Check with art stores for others
- Gallery wrapped frames (with no visible staples on side) are ok with just wire on back

Suggested Sources for frames: *Sam Flax* (on Northside Drive) not too far from IKEA, *Binders's* (Next to Kroger on Piedmont near Peachtree and Piedmont Ave intersection). They have a nice selection as well and have lots of frames for canvas. *Pearls* is not too far away on Roswell Rd.
